Part 1: Population Distribution

Examine the population density between the following pairs of countries or continents. Establish generalizations about the locations of areas of high and low levels of population. **Record all answers in your notes.**

- 1. Europe and Australia
- 2. North and Central America
- 3. Africa and Northern Eurasia (East of Rural Mountains)
- 4. South America and South East Asia

Part 2: Fertility Rates

Birth rates are usually expressed as the number of births per 1000. Make a list of the countries with the highest 10 fertility rates, and another list of the lowest 10 nations using the data for **FERTILITY RATES. Record all answers in your notes.**

Part 3: Population Growth

What is the population growth rate for Canada? Why do you think it is so low?

On the blank map label and the **top** ten nations with the highest population change rates, and in a different colour label and shade the ten nations with the **lowest** population change rates.
